

*DR.* EMMANUEL DWUSU-AFRIVIE, DIRECTOR, RESEARCH AND MACROECONOMIC MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT. Dr. Emmanuel Owusu-Afriyie was appointed Director, Research and Macroeconomic Management Department effective September 15, 2018 and assumed duty on the same date. Dr. Owusu-Afriyie is an Economist/Financial analyst. He is a product of the University of Ghana with a B.A degree in Economics with Philosophy, M.Phil. Degree in Economics and PhD in Development Economics. He has worked with the Central Bank of Ghana for almost sixteen years. For these years, he had the opportunity to provide technical support to

aid the activity of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of Bank of Ghana. Indeed, he was among the pioneer staff that established the initial technical structures to ensure a seamless commencement of the Bank of Ghana's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) in 2002. Dr. Owusu-Afrivie has worked in three key departments at Bank of Ghana: Monetary Policy and Financial Stability Department (2002-2009), Research Department (2009-2017) and Financial Stability Department (2017- Sept 2018). Within the period, he developed interest and worked effectively on issues bordering on fiscal sector developments, real sector developments and financial stability. In all these areas, he had the opportunity to make presentations at MPC meetings to inform policy formulation and implementation. Apart from playing a pivotal role in the design and implementation of surveys to monitor activities in the real sector of the Ghanaian economy, he also provided support to the Bank of Ghana's Professional Development Center by facilitating on courses related to the implications of fiscal developments for macroeconomic management and financial stability issues. He demonstrated his skills as a team player by collaborating with some colleagues to produce technical papers of which some are posted on the Central Bank's Website. One such collaborative work is published in the African Review of Economics and Finance, Volume 10, Issue 1, June 2018 with the title "Real exchange rate misalignment and macroeconomic implications: recent evidence from Ghana". He has also contributed to national economic issues by writing articles to some local print media and the Ghanaweb. Before joining the Bank of Ghana, Dr. Owusu-Afriyie worked as a graduate teaching assistant at the Economics Department, the University of Ghana from 1999-2000. He also worked as a Research Associate with the Sigma One Corporation, Ghana country office with its parent organization in North Carolina, USA. Sigma One Corporation was a research firm executing contracts under the USAID Trade and Investment Reforms Project (TIRP). He is married with three children.
